



THANK YOU

First and foremost, thank you for giving your time to our shelter dogs! By taking them out for just a few hours a day, you are helping our temporary residents exert pent up energy and get some mental stimulation by experiencing new places and people! We hope that as a result of the PAWS Around Town program, our dogs will be less anxious and exuberant when they meet potential adopters. We also hope they gain useful life skills they normally wouldn't learn from shelter life.





RULES AND AGREEMENTS

- 1. Have the dog under YOUR supervision at all times.
- 2. Never leave children unattended with any dog.
- 3. Inform us if the dog bites anyone (you included) right away.
- 4. Keep the dog on leash unless confined in your secured home/backyard.
- 5. Do not take the dog to off-leash dog areas, dog parks, or do dog introductions while on your trip.
- 6. Pick up and return the dog at the agreed upon times.
- 7. Transport the dog in a safe manner by either being in a crate or safely restrained in a back seat.
- 8. Report any behavior or medical concerns to your coordinator.
- 9. Keep the dog safe by providing adequate rest, shade, shelter and water.
- 10. Utilize only positive reinforcement training (do not verbally or physically punish the dog).
- 11. Have a charged cell phone with you at all times that can be used to contact you.
- 12. Present the dog in a positive way to potential adopters and members of the public.
- 13. Pick up any and all solid bio-waste created by the dog. The waste must be disposed of properly in a waste reciprocal.
- 14. The dog's collar must stay on the whole time.



EMERGENCIES

Situations that require immediate action



- 1. Sudden or blowout diarrhea where the dog has no control at all
- 2. Temperature over 104 Fahrenheit
- 3. Extreme Dehydration if you pinch the skin and the skin remains tented for 5 seconds (their eyes may appear to be sunken in. The gums will feel dry or tacky)
- 4. Excessive vomiting / vomiting blood, green or yellow bile.
- 5. Difficulty breathing or very shallow, labored breathing
- 6. Extreme lethargy dog is barely moving or not moving at all
- 7. Swelling of the eyes or face
- 8. Prolapsed rectum (their butthole turns inside out)
- 9. Ingestion of something toxic
- 10. Swollen or broken limbs
- 11. Seizures
- 12. Uncontrolled bleeding
- 13. Sudden disorientation or loss of coordination
- 14. Anything else that makes you think that your dog is in pain or in danger of passing away

*** Non-Emergency concerns can be noted at time of drop off ***

BEFORE YOU PICK UP YOUR ADVENTURE BUDDY

Things to note and prepare for



- 1. Be prepared for anything. Remember, we don't know what many of these dogs have been through. In some cases we don't know their past, how they have been treated, what their living situation once was, and most importantly, we don't know their true personality. All we do know is what we see here at our facility and what little (if any) information their previous caretaker provided. We try our very best to match you with a dog that we think will do well with you, but your dog may have a very different personality once they are comfortable.
- 2. Ready your car with the appropriate amount of space for the dog. Depending on the dog, you may need enough space for a size appropriate crate, a friend to help contain the dog to the back seat, or a barrier to avoid the dog from getting to the driver and passengers seat.
- 3. Please plan to leave your own pet(s) at home! The goal of our day trips is to give the dog a break from the shelter and some one on one time with humans. Although most of our shelter dogs do well with other animals and enjoy doggie playtime, we prefer these field trips to be geared towards interacting with humans and not other pets. PAWS of Grays Harbor is not liable for the treatment or cost of vet bills incurred for your own pets at your private veterinarian.
- 4. If you plan to take your dog home, please check your fence line and property for holes, loose planks, poisonous plants, foxtails, and dangerous household items. Even if you have/had a dog that has never gotten loose, please don't assume that your property is secure. We don't know the history of most of the dogs we place and the majority of them were strays.



IF YOUR DOG GETS LOOSE

Step one - Keep your cool!

Sometimes despite our best intentions, a dog will get loose. Please try not to panic. If you can see the dog, try calling them. Some of our more social guests may come right to you, but very often even social dogs get frightened once they get loose. You may be more successful calling them to get their attention and then walking the opposite direction, kneeling down and digging in the dirt like you've just found something extremely interesting. Reaching for a scared dog will often cause them to bolt and can also result in a bite, so please use caution and only reach for the dog if you feel you can safely do so. If the dog is in an area that is secured but is so scared that they are growling at you, please call us so that we can help! If the dog is already in a flat out run and panicked, they may not respond to you at all. Please try following them from a distance so that you can see the direction they are going and hopefully catch up to them once they have slowed down. If they enter a yard, garage, etc., please secure the area to make sure they can't bolt again before attempting to lure them to you. We understand that every circumstance is different and that luring your dog to you may not be possible, please call us if this is the case!

All of our dogs are equipped with a Fi tracking collar. During your orientation, a staff member will help you download the Fi app and connect to your dog's collar. This will enable you and us to keep track of your dog's location while you are out and about on your field trip. If your dog gets loose and heads out of your line of sight, please use the Fi app to track his location.



WHAT HAPPENS IF A BITE OCCURS?



If the dog bites anyone (you included) we need to know right away. If the dog bites a stranger, please take all of their information so that we can contact them to fill out the appropriate paperwork. We will need you to document what happened and the location and severity of the wound. We are required by law to report any bites that break skin to the appropriate animal control agency. We will also need to follow state laws for quarantine. A bite is not an automatic reason for euthanasia, so please do not hesitate reporting it. If you are seeing any signs of aggression, even if it is very minor, please contact your coordinator immediately. Please note that all dogs sent out on a Paws Around Town outting are fully vaccinated.

ADOPTION?

If you encounter someone who is interested in adopting your dog, please give them the dog's business card so that they may follow up with them. In general, the adoption fee for our dogs is between \$150-\$350 and includes vaccinations (UP TO DATE OF ADOPTION), microchipping, spay/neuter surgeries, and some doggy supplies. The majority of our adoptions occur as a result of the dogs being seen on our website. It is very important that we have adorable photos and if possible, a great video. Please be sure to share any photos and videos taken on your day out via adopt@pawsgh.org or by messaging us on Facebook. We need your help to make sure our dogs are seen as much as possible!

MEDIA CONTENT

Most of our dogs get adopted through their online profile. It is encouraged to take photos and videos of you and your pup on your day out. Please post on any and all social media to get their faces out there and be sure to tag PAWS of Grays Harbor. Please also email any dog media to adopt@pawsgh.org so that we may add to their online profiles.

Things to Keep in Mind!

- You must send us your itinerary before you start your adventure. Please use the QR code to fill out an itinerary form.
- You must stay within two hours of PAWS of Grays Harbor. We need to make sure we can reach you in the event of an emergency.
- You cannot leave the state of Washington. There's so much here to explore!
- Your PAWS Around Town adventure has to be at least two hours long. If you are interested in taking one of our dogs out for a period shorter than two hours, please apply to be a volunteer dog walker. Check out the Volunteer section of our website!
