We could not change the lives of so many animals without the dedication and love of our committed volunteers. These people make it possible!

Milestones Matter

One early morning, we got a call from Companion Animal Hospital. A woman had rushed in barefoot, carrying her small grey pitbull and begging for help. She had no money, no home - only the love of a dog who was barely clinging to life. Companion couldn't intake animals themselves, so they called us. We said yes.

That grey pitbull, whom we'd come to call Zora, was barely breathing. She was malnourished, suffering from trauma after being hit by a car, and later diagnosed with Salmon poisoning. Even our most seasoned staff weren't sure she'd pull through. But Zora made one thing clear: she wasn't giving up. So neither were we.

She received round-the-clock care - hourly feedings, constant IV fluids, a mountain of medication, and a tidal wave of love. Our vet tech Callie even took her home to monitor her through the night. Day by day, Zora fought her way back. And just when she was finally ready to be adopted, we realized she'd already chosen her family: Callie. Today, Zora is thriving at home, exactly where she belongs.

Zora's story captures the heart of 2024. It was a year full of need—a year that stretched us, tested us, and demanded more than we thought we had. Requests to surrender animals surged again. Costs climbed as the average length of stay increased. But thanks to the determination of the PAWS of Grays Harbor family, we rose to the challenge.



We welcomed more animals than ever before, with a 7.13% increase in intake. That may sound small - but for a shelter of our size, it was a mighty effort. And against all odds, we raised our save rate to 99%. That number isn't just a statistic. It represents lives like Zora's.

2024 also brought dreams to life. We launched our PAWS Around Town program, allowing community members to "check out" shelter dogs for a few hours of adventure. These field trips ease stress, boost adoptability, and build bonds that ripple far beyond our walls.

Through our PAWSitively Perfect Reading partnership with the local library, school-age kids read to calm shelter cats in cozy corners - improving literacy and offering comfort in equal measure.

At zero cost to the shelter, we proudly launched our first-ever PAWS calendar, showcasing local pets and businesses and raising over \$2,500—all of which went directly toward lifesaving care.

None of this would have been possible without you—our fosters, volunteers, donors, partners, and friends. You made every comeback, every program, every new beginning possible.

As we look ahead, we carry with us the lessons of 2024: that community is our greatest strength, and that the smallest act of compassion can save a life.

No Kill for 12 Years

What Does It Mean To Be No Kill?

When discussing no kill, the numbers matter. Every life is a number and every life counts. There are two common ways to determine if a shelter or rescue is no kill: save rate and human population benchmark.



Save Rate

An organization must have a Save Rate of more than 90% of their animals to be considered no kill. A Save Rate is determined by the ratio of animals with "Live Outcomes" divided by the number of "Total Outcomes".

Our Save Rate

Human Population Benchmark

To be considered no kill, an organization must have a Human Population Benchmark (HPB) of no more than 2 animals per every 1,000 people yearly. The HPB is determined by the ratio of animals "Without Live Outcomes" yearly divided by the number of 1,000 people in the community population.

Our Policy

P.A.W.S. of Grays Harbor is to only euthanize pets not able to be rehabilitated; those which are hopelessly suffering or dangerous to other people or pets. This decision is never taken lightly. The numbers above represent every animal that passes while in our care.

We share these numbers in hopes of giving people a better understanding of what it means to be a no kill shelter. Every one of these lives matters to us.

Notes: Stray intake numbers primarily refer to cats. We also partner with local Animal Control agencies to help rehome stray, unclaimed dogs.

As many people in our community are suffering greatly economically, it is not surprising to see a rise in surrenders due to financial reasons.

Lack of affordable pet-friendly housing continues to add to the demand to surrender pets and we have seen a rising trend of animals simply abandoned at rental properties.




Shelter Animal Outcomes

Goals Met in 2024

- In collaboration with Stafford Creek Corrections Center, doubled the capacity of our Freedom Tails program by onboarding another cell block into the program. We increased our capacity for dogs and handlers in the program by 100%
- We unveiled our Doggy Day Out program, allowing our shelter dogs to enjoy adventures out in our community with passionate members of the public.
- We increased overall intake by 7.13% while also pushing our save rate to our highest yet - 99%!
- We partnered with the Timberland Library in Aberdeen to create the PAWSitively Perfect Reading partnership where school-age kids read to calm shelter cats in cozy corners—improving literacy and offering comfort in equal measure.

Future Goals

- Humane Education
- Increase and improve upon our Foster Program with an emphasis on recruiting more large dog fosters
- Partner with the Hoquiam Library to expand the reach of our PAWSitively Purrfect Reading Program.
- Decrease the average length of stay for our shelter animals
